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A Solution to the South African Political ~~Pro~~ Conflict.

1. The population of South Africa should be classified into only two main groups viz the Black group and the White group.
2. In drawing the new constitution the numerical size of the group should be disregarded.

Form of first elections in the country

Each group should hold two elections.

1. The election of two leaders for the group
2. The election of members of Parliament for that group

The election of two Black Leaders.

All Black leaders of registered political parties should stand for elections. All Black voters in South Africa should elect from them the two leaders, one to lead the Labour party and the other the Conservative party. The names of the two parties should not be A.N.C, N.P, I.F.P, C.P, P.A.C, A.Z.A.P.O, A.W.B etc

The election of two White Leaders

The two white leaders should be elected in the same way by the white electorate. One to lead the white Labour party and the other to lead the white conservative party.

Form of second elections in the country.

1. Black group: During the second election the Black voters will elect ~~from~~ Labour members of ^{Parliament} and Conservative members of Parliament in the various Regions in the Transvaal, O.F.S., Natal and Cape Province.
2. White group: The white electorate will carry out elections in the same way as with the Black electorate basing the choice on Labour and conservative.

Seats in Parliament

1. The Black Labour M.P.s. should sit with the white ^{Labour} M.P.s as a party and

2. The Black Conservative M.P.s should sit with the White Conservative M.P.s. as a party.
3. The party in majority should be the governing party for 5 years and its leader the President.

Number of M.P.s to be elected in each Province.

The number of M.P.s in each province elected by the Black group and the white group should be as follows: These can total ~~25~~ or 50 or 100 per province.

Passing a Bill or Repealing an Act of Parliament

A $\frac{2}{3}$ majority should stand as a criterion for passing or repealing an Act of Parliament. This will enable the minority party in the elections to consent or refuse what ever legislation is brought before Parliament.

Such a system will prevent the struggle for power between Blacks and Whites, between Black and Black, and between White and White. Such a system will bring peace and prosperity in our beloved country.
